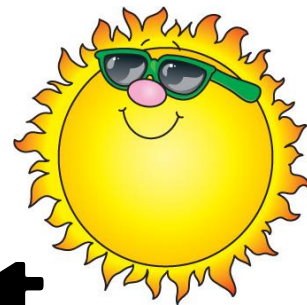

Early Literacy Tip

Having a good vocabulary, or knowing the meanings of words, is critical to your children being able to understand what they will later read. Young children understand the meanings of words not just from what you say but also by watching your facial expressions and your gestures, and by listening to the tone of your voice. As you spend time with your children, when you sing, talk, read, write, and play with them, you are helping develop their prereading (early literacy) skills.



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
