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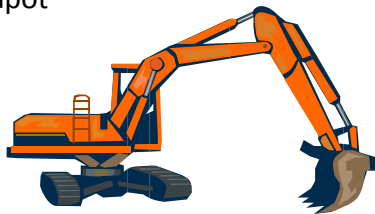

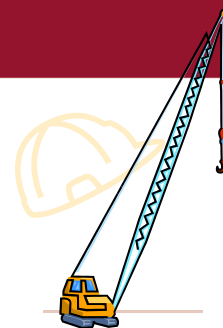

Early Literacy Tip

Use concept words with your child to expand their vocabulary. Concept words help describe things, such as position/location, quantity, quality or texture/material. (ex: The *small, yellow* duck is *fluffy*.) A large vocabulary helps children learn to read, and concept words help them understand the relationship between things. We want our children to learn not only that ice is *cold* and fire is *hot* but also that cold and hot are *opposites*.



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
