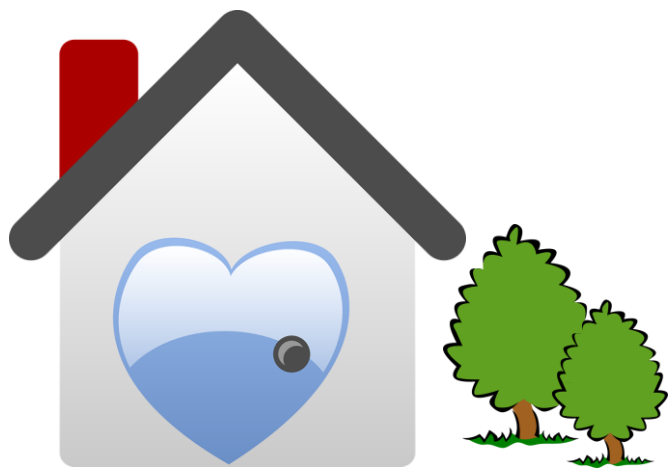

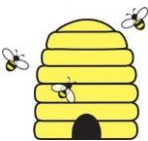
Houses, Finger Play
