Dear Library Friends,

As we enter the third year of the pandemic, it is gratifying to look back at how user-focused and flexible Sioux City Public Library staff have been and continue to be in serving our community. After a year of having limited services, staff and patrons were more than happy to return to a sense of normalcy. Staff were eager to resume in-person programming, including offering new programs such as Writers Circle, Teen Writing Club, the Adult Summer Reading Trivia event, and Baby Boot Camp.

Due to a retirement and staff turnover, there were a number of promotions among current staff as well as hiring of new staff. Thanks, in part, to these fresh perspectives from staff in new positions, exciting changes have been happening. Creating an exceptional user experience is always the top priority of the Library and to help meet that need, staff studied the layout at the Perry Creek Branch and rearranged some resources to give it an updated and more inviting look. Patrons have voiced their delight in these changes. Staff also focused on getting the word out about all our wonderful services through social media and other outlets. The Library's Facebook and Instagram accounts have reached more people than ever before. Reader Services staff also planned and implemented our biggest Adult Summer Reading Program vet. with more than double the number of participants from the previous record-breaking year, which also featured our first mascot, a Sasquatch named Kevin who loves to gobble up a good book!

In April, the Sioux City Council proclaimed April 4-10 *Library Week in Sioux City*, which coincided with *National Library Week*. That same month, the Friends of the Sioux City Public Library held their first book sale since 2019 and it was a huge success. The proceeds from this sale fund the Youth Summer Reading Program as well as numerous other important projects not included in the Library's regular budget.

Library staff are preparing for the next three years by creating a new strategic plan that will continue to focus on the user experience and follow the latest and greatest trends in public libraries. The **Sioux City Public Library** is committed to being a safe space where "All Are Welcome."

Sioux City Public Library forms partnerships with a variety of organizations to help further its mission to provide equal access to quality resources for personal empowerment and community enrichment. Partnerships provide the Library with additional audiences, input on diversity, and access to new programs.

In partnership with *Siouxland Public Media*, the Sioux City Public Library is able to share book recommendations and author interviews with radio listeners.

Check it Out

Check It Out is a weekly spotlight on literature and book culture that *Siouxland Public Media* co-produces with the Sioux City Public Library. Library staff and enthusiasts share books they love with public radio listeners. 38 new segments aired on KWIT in the 2021-2022 year.

The First Fifty Pages

The Library partnered with KWIT to host a diverse line-up of authors on the podcast: *The First Fifty Pages*. Dean Koontz, Emily St. John Mandel, V.E Schwab, and Alice Hoffman were some of the star-studded authors who spoke with Library hosts Jenn Delperdang (Circulation Services Manager) and Kelsey Patterson (Morningside Branch Supervisor). Il authors were featured in podcast episodes throughout the last year.

The Difference is Dialogue

In partnership with the *Sioux City Community Inclusion Liason, Semehar Ghebrekidan*, this event series was launched in January 2022 and is an initiative of the City. It serves as a way for the community to have honest conversations about tough topics. Conversations include group dialogues, panels and more. The Sioux City Public Library provides staff, promotion, space and book recommendations for these events. Reader Services Librarian, Michael Maxwell, also worked with the Friends of the Sioux City Public Library to acquire a grant for additional Library resources to support these events.

Adult Summer Reading

Sioux City Public Library crafted a revamped Adult Summer Reading Program for 2022. This program followed the same timeline as the Youth Summer Reading Program and used the Beanstack Tracker App, the same app used in the Youth program, so parents and caregivers could earn badges and prize entries alongside their children and teens. The Library hopes these tie-ins encourage a love of reading for all family members.

The Library held a trivia night kickoff event with 90+ attendees in partnership with a local business, Buffalo Alice. Attendees enjoyed an evening of trivia, received information about the Library's *Summer Reading Programs* and voted to name our Summer Reading mascot.

The Library also hosted a Zoom event with Doug Bierend, author of *In Search of Mycotopia: Citizen Science, Fungi Fanatics, and the Untapped Potential of Mushrooms,* one of the books selected for the Adult Summer Reading List.

Over the course of summer, 300 adults signed up on the Beanstack Tracker App and earned 1,510 badges. The most popular badges earned were for checking out a book from a Library display, time spent reading, reading a book from the Summer Reading book list and telling a

friend about Summer Reading.



Homebound Services

Library volunteers gave **89.25** hours of home delivery service in FY22 to ensure households in Sioux City were served.

Open Book Club

Sioux City Public Library hosts *Open Book Club* the first Monday of each month at two locations. This lively discussion with fellow reading enthusiasts averages **20 participants each month**. The *Open Book Club* also participates in the *All Iowa Reads* initiative with a special event each year.



Community Outreach

The Sioux City Public Library attends community events to educate children and adults about the Library. Attending events allows staff to interact with thousands of Sioux City residents who may be unfamiliar with Library programs and services.

In addition to the thousands of amazing books and resources at the Library, over 1800 young patrons kept their brains strong by paticipating in the Summer Reading Program. Participants read 7,062 picture books and school-age children and teens logged 232,254 minutes of chapter books on the Beanstack Tracker App. That's over 160 days of reading! Over 1500 children & teens picked up Summer Reading Starter Packs from the Library.

All Summer Reading events and activities were free and open to all. Over 200 attendees joined the Library for the Youth Summer Reading Kickoff event with musician Duke Otherwise. Weekly Imagination Builders events used hands-on STEAM based activities to take stories beyond the pages of the book.



Over 80 teens participated in the Library's afterhours event, Expedition: Seeking Sasquatch.

In partnership with Woodbury County 4-H, youth in grades 4-8 attended Innovation Studio with hands-on STEM-based learning modules focusing on horticulture and agriculture. Over 80 teens attended a special after-hours event, Expedition: Seeking **Sasquatch** to solve puzzles, compete in challenges, and look for clues to solve the mystery of Bigfoot. Kids also enjoyed Readto-Me-Dogs events, Storytimes, LEGO events, and a Wild About Reptiles event in partnership with the Dorothy Pecaut Nature Center and their scalv ambassadors.

Local businesses supported the Summer Reading Program by donating around \$6,000 in coupons for free food & activities. Coupons were awarded to children ages 0-18 in their Summer Reading Starter Packs. Powell Broadcasting donated \$7,500 of free radio PSAs for the Summer Reading Program.

Bridge to Reading

The Sioux City Public Library took part in the annual Iowa Bridge to Reading Picture Book Award voting event. Bridge to Reading promotes early literacy and reading to children through the introduction of quality picture books. Children are encouraged to read, or have a caregiver read to them, five of the 10 books nominated and then vote for their favorite.





A love of reading starts young, and the Library believes reading to children is one of the best ways to encourage that spark. In the 2021-2022 year, the Library held over 60 storytimes at our Library locations with 895 children and 656 adults in attendance. Over 2,000 children heard stories, songs and rhymes when youth staff presented 141 storytimes at 25 Sioux City child care centers.

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

1000 Books Before Kindergarten program encourages parents to read to their kids frequently. Research shows that reading to your child is the most reliable predictor of school success. Using the Beanstack App, parents track the books they read to their child. Kids receive a special reward for every 200 books read. In 2021-2022, 307 kids enrolled and recorded 33,743 books.

Visiting Groups

Sioux City Public Library works with local schools, child care programs and learning centers to provide staff and resources for any area group who wishes to visit the Library. Tour groups recieve tailored information prepared by staff for the needs of their age range or interest. This summer 659 kids and caregivers visited the Library with a group.

Sioux City Community Schools Event Partnership

In honor of National Reading Month, the Library partnered with Sioux City Community Schools for a special reading event at the Aalfs Downtown Library. Sioux City Community **School** leaders read stories to attendees. A book walk. crafts, activities, and snacks were part of the event. Sioux City Public Schools Foundation also gave away free books. 184 children and adults attended this event.

Our Bookshelf Partnership

Sioux City Public Library partnered with Iowa State University (ISU) Extension for the program, Our Bookshelf. This program provides free books and classes to help parents and caregivers of preschool age children learn about reading techniques and ideas on how to make reading fun for themselves and their children.



The Library provides a variety of tech services for the Sioux City community including computer labs at both Aalfs Downtown and Morningside Branch locations, Smarter Hotspots for checkout, Wifi, printing, mobile printing, tech consultations, and a variety of databases and eResources.

Hotspots

Provided by a grant from Missouri River Historical District (MRHD), the Library has 12 *Smarter Hotspot* devices available for patrons. Checkouts on these devices have doubled form the previous year and all devices are often checked out.

Sioux City Public Library provides patrons an online Library of eBooks, eAudiobooks, music, and movies accessible on their smart devices. Early in the pandemic, these **eResources** were essential for continued access to Library materials. As pandemic restrictions wane, **eResources** have continued to be a patron staple for accessing Library resources.

Total FY22 e-resource checkouts:

84,304 (-5%*) **29%** of total checkouts.

*compared to 88,838 checkouts in FY21, accounting for 38% of total checkouts – Library had reduced hours for 11 months of that term.

Checkouts are overall still lower than pre-pandemic numbers - except the number of **eResource** checkouts which is higher than pre-pandemic **eResource** checkouts by 12%.
