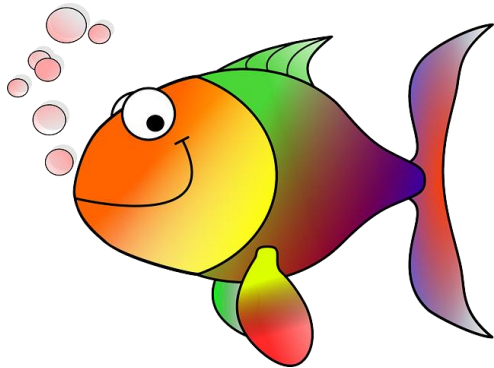

[Twist hand right and left]

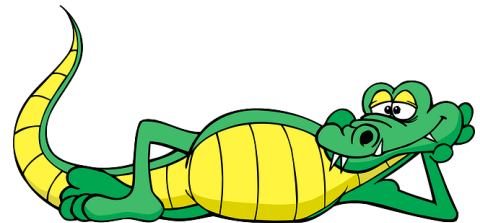
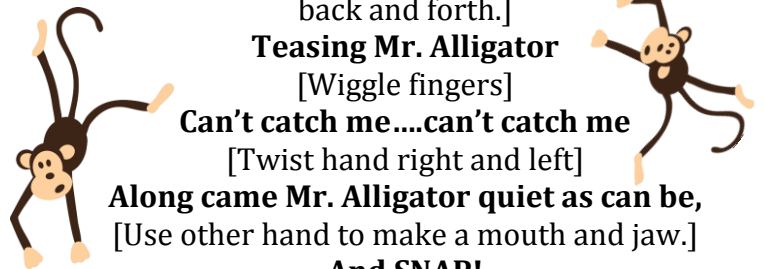
**Along came Mr. Alligator quiet as can be,**
